STATE LEADERSHIP CONFERENCE: PREVIEW AND TIPS

FBLA members from various corners of New York have dedicated their entire year to meticulous preparations for the upcoming State Leadership Conference (SLC). The anticipation has been building, with active participation in program of work initiatives and rigorous practice for competitive events. Now, as the conference looms on the horizon and is set to unfold in the lively city of Rochester, NY, from April 9-11, it's high time to shift our focus to the practical aspects of the event - starting with that to pack.

For the three-day, two-night duration of the State Leadership Conference, business attire is a must. Plan to bring at least two dress shirts, a jacket, dress pants, and, for some, a business dress or pencil skirt as alternatives. Business shoes are an additional essential. However, given that not every moment will require formal wear, ensure you also pack comfortable clothes for downtime and a themed outfit for the state dance party.

Rochester's climate calls for preparation against the cold, even though most activities will be indoors. FBLA members have found it beneficial to include a coat and warm layers in their luggage, despite the budding spring weather in their respective regions of New York. Alongside your main luggage, don't forget a day bag for the conference. When it comes to competitions, remember to pack a laptop or portable device, as New York FBLA objective tests are administered through personal device. Additionally, load up on school supplies for the conference. Although the State Leadership Conference lasts only three days, a true Future Business Leader stays proactive. Before heading to the conference, communicate with your teacher about your impending absence, and make arrangements to collect any assignments you might miss. While SLC may be a bustling affair, there is enough flexibility in scheduling to effectively keep up with your academic responsibilities.

SPRING DISTRICT MEETING GUIDE

The Spring District Meeting is on February 8, 2025 from 9:00am to 12:00pm at Williamsville East High School, 151 Paradise Road, Williamsville NY 14051.

(Registration begins at 9:00am and competitive events begin at 9:30am.)

The performance events at the Spring District Meeting will be Job Interview, Impromptu Speaking, Client Service, Public Speaking, Introduction to Decision Making (Grades 9-10), Introduction to Decision Making (Grades 9-10), and Introduction to Public Speaking (Grades 9-10).

Advisors should instruct their members to read the guidelines for each event. Students can enter ONE of the performance events and either or both FBL or Parliamentary Procedure (but only 2 events total). Only those students who have submitted State Officer applications and have undergone interviews can take the State Officer Exam.

The topic for the Public Speaking Speech is: The Power of Networking: Building

The topic for the Introduction to Public Speaking Speech is: How volunteerism and community service can shape your future as a leader?

The registration fee per student will be \$5 (non-refundable for students who do not show up or "change their mind" about competing.) Each chapter should complete the registration form sent to them and return to Gloria LaSota by

January 31st along

with the total registration fee. Checks should be made payable to WEHS FBLA. The following written events will be held on Feb. 8: Parliamentary Procedure, Future Business Leader, and State Officer Exam.

Students will be sent a performance time/reporting time which they must follow. Once again, the deadline for receiving your chapters' registration and fees is JANUARY 31. Sufficient time is needed to schedule each individual competitor.
