District 7's Holland Patent FBLA Chapter had quite a busy fall season! Over the past four months, they've organized fun, community-engaging events and worked hard to grow their chapter.

The Holland Patent FBLA runs the Knights' Corner Store out of a small room by the cafeteria each year. Despite its lack of size, FBLA members, including multiple officers, contributed to the improvement and maintenance of the store. Additionally, members and students are offered opportunities to manage the store during the class periods in which it is open. They gain leadership skills, experience with management, and entrepreneurship through their work. This year, an FBLA member completed our member discount chart, which allows students in FBLA to receive discounts on the items they purchase. The Knights' Corner Store generates a large annual profit thanks to its hard-working employees, FBLA members, and unconditional support from Holland Patent students and staff.







The HP FBLA held its first annual fall craft fair on September 21st to kick off the year. The event was planned during the previous school year and required constant communication with vendors and advertising for attendees. Holland Patent hosted over thirty vendors with a wide range of unique products at the event. Many of the vendors in attendance were locally or student-run. The craft fair also had a bake sale, Knights' Corner Store booth, and catering, courtesy of Little Jordino's. A basket raffle was held, including vendor-donated baskets. The event profited over \$1000.

The second annual HP FBLA Haunted House was held on October 26th. This event required extensive planning. This was our largest volunteer event, with over 30 volunteers, and the Haunted House theme this year was "Twisted Circus." Most of the event is funded by FBLA and any donated items we can gather. Most of the volunteers for this event were scare actors, who were costumed as circus performers including contortionists, magicians, ringmasters, and trapeze artists. The premise of this event allowed crucial leadership skills to combine with creativity and a touch of acting. Non-scare actor volunteers included makeup artists, ticket salespeople, greeters, and gym monitors. In addition to the haunted house, games were held in the gym, and there was a bake sale. Attendance numbers greatly rewarded an exhausting day of decorating and preparing. The total profit of the event was around \$850.
